#### Failure of Rule of Law

- Large pendency and inordinate delays in courts.
  - Trial courts pendency 3.4
     crore and 1.1 crore criminal
     & civil cases respectively.
  - About 60% of the cases are more than an year old.
- Criminal cases outnumber civil cases
- Lowest conviction rate 50.4%

#### **Avoidable Suffering & Unfulfilled Potential**

- Failure in healthcare delivery
  - About 5.5 crore people fall into poverty every year because of healthcare costs
  - 26% of deaths are caused by mostly preventable communicable, maternal, neonatal & nutritional diseases
- School education abysmal learning outcomes
  - 60% of Std. V students cannot read a Std. II level text
  - 55% of Std. VIII students cannot divide

## **Net Result – Emerging Challenges**



- > Those who can pay cease to be consumers of public utilities
- Those with voice have fewer stakes in governance
- Vote de-linked from public good; taxes de-linked from services; & authority de-linked from accountability
- > Distortions in the political process money power, populism, primordial loyalties
